## The Match of the Century

### A Little Bit Of History

It is fitting that the World Shooting Complex is being constructed in Illinois, and that it will host the Amateur Trapshooting Association's Grand American event in 2006. Over 100,000 people are expected to attend that annual event next year in Sparta. Not many people know that over 100 years ago, two men from Illinois, who also happened to be the best shotgun shooters in the country, went shoulder-to-shoulder in a series of trapshooting matches that had everyone in the world of outdoor sports buzzing. Captain Adam Bogardus, who lived many years in Illinois, was renowned for his skill with a shotgun. He held a record of hitting 6000 two-inch glass balls with 6013 shots. He also manufactured his own line of glass ball targets. Capt. Bogardus had quite a following of loyal fans. His challenger was a younger, mountain of a man named Doc Carver. Born in Winslow, Illinois, Doc Carver earned his fame as a crack rifle shot and a market hunter.

Because he was at the top of the trapshooting sport in the USA, and because he had nothing to gain, Capt. Bogardus put off the challenge made by Doc Carver for six years. Then, finally, he agreed to a match with Doc. But could this young challenger really expect to upstage the old master wing shooter? The whole country was eager to find out. Their first match was held in Louisville, Ky. on February 22, 1883. It seemed like side bets were being made everywhere by everyone. As that first match progressed, the old master, Capt. Bogardus, faltered, and the young challenger, Doc Carver, came on strong. After 100 live pigeons were released for each shooter, the final score was 83 for Doc Carver and 82 for Capt. Bogardus.

Was that first match a fluke? Is Doc really that good? Has Capt. Bogardus lost his edge? Many such thoughts swarmed through the minds of sportsmen after that first match. Capt. Bogardus then challenged Doc Carver to another match. The challenge was accepted, and the two star trap shooters were off to Chicago for their second match. Once again, 100 live pigeons were released for each shooter, and Doc Carver knocked down 82 of his while Capt. Bogardus got 79 of his targets. After this main event, they shot an extra match using some new fangled targets made by Gregory Ligowsky of Cincinnati, Ohio. Some called these new targets "mud saucers" because they were made entirely out of clay. Doc won that match, too, beating Capt. Bogardus by a score of 72 to 63.

Capt. Bogardus was humiliated by his 0-3 record against his younger challenger, and he was equally determined to redeem himself. Recognizing this moment in trapshooting history was a golden opportunity to promote his new clay targets, Greg Ligowsky then made an offer to Doc Carver and Capt. Bogardus they could not refuse.

His proposal to them was to conduct a series of 25 matches of 100 targets each to be held in cities throughout the country. Ligowsky would pay the winner of each match \$300. Not only did the two men eagerly agree, they also decided that whoever won the most matches would keep the entire \$7500 in prize money. So, off they went to St. Louis, Omaha, Pittsburgh, Boston, Philadelphia, Indianapolis, and 18 other cities. When it was all over, Doc Carver won by shooting 93 percent of his targets compared to 87 percent for Capt. Bogardus. It was a fascinating time for trapshooting in America, and we can expect some fascinating stories to unfold from the new World Shooting Complex in Sparta, Illinois in the future.

## SCSC Youth Hunt – 2005

Ten young aspiring hunters signed up for the 2005 SCSC sponsored youth hunt. The hunt was open to children, grandchildren and nieces and nephews ( under the age of 19 ) of SCSC members. All youngsters needed to have passed the hunter safety program and have a valid hunting license to participate in the youth hunt.

The program began on the Sunday before the hunt with some practice shooting at the SCSC trap range. Some of the top shooters showed up to guide the young hunters with their shooting skills. Mark Zapoy, Cle Rector, Karen Spearing and Laura Andersen helped the youngsters develop good shotgun mounting and shooting techniques, simulating pheasant hunting conditions. Karen Spearing gave the group a refresher on gun safety.

The day of the hunt started at 8:30 a.m. with registration, while bird planters were gathering birds, dog handlers were tending to their pointers, and Laura Andersen gave a very interactive gun safety review. While the bird planters were busy planting birds, Larry Nemecc conducted a dog demonstration so the youngsters could see how the dogs work in the field and how to safely flush and shoot with dogs in the field. Emphasis was placed on never shooting on the ground or at low flying birds when dogs are in the field. Two birds were pointed, shot and retrieved to hand giving the group a good idea of how to hunt with dogs. Laura and Chris Andersen's professionally trained dog did a great job of pointing, holding the point and retrieving the bird to hand.

The youngsters were broken into three teams and introduced to their dog handler and dog. Laura Andersen and her dog led Team One, Ed Spearing and his dog led Team Two and Steve Terrell and his dog led Team Three. Larry Nemecc and "Kiss Me Kate" were back ups if needed. Each parent was required to walk behind the young hunter and monitor safety conditions. While the youth were scouring the field looking for pheasants, Andy Keil fired up the grill and he and his wife began preparations to feed the hungry hunters when they returned about 1 p.m. Everyone, including the property owners, Larry and his wife, enjoyed the great lunch. The birds were tagged, stories about missed shots were shared and several youngsters went home with a pheasant. Laura Andersen also gave a cleaning demonstration, showing all how to quickly breast out a pheasant.

A good time and safe hunt was had by all. Thanks to the Spearings, Andersons, and Keils, thanks also to Cle Rector who worked with Gander Mountain to support the hunt, Steve Terrell for guiding and thanks to all the parents who made time for their kids to hunt.

If you are interested in having your youngster participate next year, make sure that they pass the hunter safety course before October 1st of 2006.

It takes only one stray bullet that leaves the confines of the club and only one or two people who don't believe in following the rules to take away the privileges of the rest of the responsible members. Please don't let that happen. Be aware of what your neighbor is doing on the range.
